

4 // JACK AND JEAN LESLIE RIVERWALK™

Are you a family of cyclists? Walkers, runners or strollers? No matter your mode of transportation, your family will love getting some fresh air along the RiverWalk pathway. Keep an eye out for geese, beavers, kayakers and fly fishers along the river, and for public art, lounge chairs and cool buildings on the East Village side.

5 // CROSSROADS PLAYGROUND

A roller slide, balance boards, an oversized xylophone and bongos encourage creativity and imagination, while adults can relax at the bistro sets laid out next to the community garden.
